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## Why the paper is being presented

The paper is presented to provide an update on activities since the last meeting of the Board and to seek approval for an amendment to the 2022/23 budget as recommended by the Audit Committee.

## Report

## Top issues

Financial sustainability: we are continuing to work on plans to increase income streams through fundraising and commercial activity, however the back drop of domestic economic instability (Brexit, cost of living crisis, financial markets) is making this more complex and challenging. We have received an interim report from Greenmiles on funding and are in the process of looking at the recommendations to determine our response. The CEO will update Board members at the next opportunity on the report and the Executive team's response.

The business plan was published in 2020 having been developed in 2019. The CEO will start a process of review, to either update or replace the business plan with a new 5 year strategy.

## **Communications and publicity**

#### Press releases:

The following press releases have been distributed since the last Board meeting:

- Flats recycling report 18<sup>th</sup> July 2022 the detailed report outlining results of the Ecosurety project to improve recycling on estates of purpose-built flats in Lambeth, supported by the London Borough of Lambeth and Peabody. The release was shared primarily with trade titles covering local government, environment and waste and recycling.
- The Mindful Shopper 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022 the launch of the new citizen platform to help people live a life with less waste. Two versions of the press release went out, one via a third party agency to consumer titles; and one distributed by ReLondon to trades including a range of environment titles.
- Food Wave 'Food Action Festival' 4<sup>th</sup> July 2022 a press release announcing the street action in Angel Central shopping centre in Islington, which was distributed by Angel Central's PR agencies.

Media coverage achieved since the last Board meeting relating to these and other events, projects and partnerships is at Appendix 2.

#### Events:

Circular Economy Week took place from 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> June; results are shown in the programme update paper.

Other events at which ReLondon has been represented since the last Board meeting include:

- Reset Connect 28<sup>th</sup> 29<sup>th</sup> June 2022 conference for sustainable business, entrepreneurs and SMEs at which Lamia Sbiti and Andrea Charlson participated in four separate panel discussions on circularity, sharing economy and the built environment.
- Open House Festival 10<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022 the CIRCuIT team
  developed and hosted an Open House event at The Hithe, a fully demountable
  circular workspace in Rotherhithe, welcoming interested visitors to the space,
  running a hackathon with built environment innovators from across the city and
  curating an Open House collection of circular exemplar buildings for people to
  visit during the festival.
- LARAC conference and awards 6<sup>th</sup> October 2022 Cathy Cook, Liz Horsfield and Amy Casey will be presenting the Flats Recycling Report and toolkit at this conference for UK's waste and recycling specialists.
- Zero Waste Week Event: ReLondon @Deutsche Bank 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022 Lamia Sbiti and Ali Moore presented a 1h lunchtime session about the environmental, commercial and economic potential for the circular economy to 120+ global employees of Deutsche Bank, emphasising how businesses and individuals can contribute to the transition to a circular economy.

### Awards:

ReLondon has been shortlisted for a number of awards:

- National Recycling Awards shortlisted for 'Partnership Excellence (public/private sector) for the flats recycling project; and for 'Campaign of the year' for the London Recycles 'Be that person' campaign.
- LARAC awards shortlisted twice in the new Circular Economy Achievement category: firstly, in partnership with Islington Council for the Circular Economy strategy, Academy and Business Grant Scheme work; and, secondly, in partnership with the London Borough of Bexley with Olio and Kitche for the Bexley Food Waste Reduction project.

## **Dashboard Project Commentary**

Detailed updates on programmes are included in paper 3. The dashboard is attached at Appendix 1. Commentary below details project changes highlighted on the dashboard.

The 'Data/Insights on market opportunities for businesses' has changed from grey to green as we have begun scoping the research question for this project. We have refined the scope of the research question to focus on the operational/financial factors of success for circular business models in London, to support investor due diligence - we will be validating the research question through structured interviews with investors in coming weeks.

The Circular Economy Directory project has been split into two projects – The Mindful Shopper and The Circular Economy Matchmaker. The Directory project was previously amber due to the scope issues, but these have now been resolved with the development of two separate business cases for the two products.

Circular Economy Week 2022 has moved from green to grey as it was completed in June.

'Commercial marketing' has changed from grey to amber, as two highly productive workshops have taken place to identify marketing priorities, audiences and messages for the next 6 months. However, capacity in the team means that, although a plan has been drafted and activity has started in support of those priorities, a finalised plan has not yet been signed off.

Recycle Week 2022 has changed from grey to green, as dates have been moved from late September to October 17<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup>. An update on ReLondon's Recycle Week plans is in the programme paper.

### **Audit Committee Activity**

The Committee, chaired by Joe Murphy, had one scheduled meeting on 8 September. Unfortunately, insufficient members were able to attend to make a quorum.

## **Budget Amendment**

The Committee had previously requested adjustments to the 2022/23 budget to recognise increased focus and ambition in relation to fundraising.

The revised budget is shown in the table below showing an income target increased by £553k, which includes the £150k secured for the London Food Campaign for this financial year and a further £402k in new grants.

This proposal was formally reviewed and agreed by the Audit Committee via the written resolution procedure and the Board is recommended to approve this amendment to the budget.

If approved by the Board, this revised budget will become the baseline that we report against quarterly.

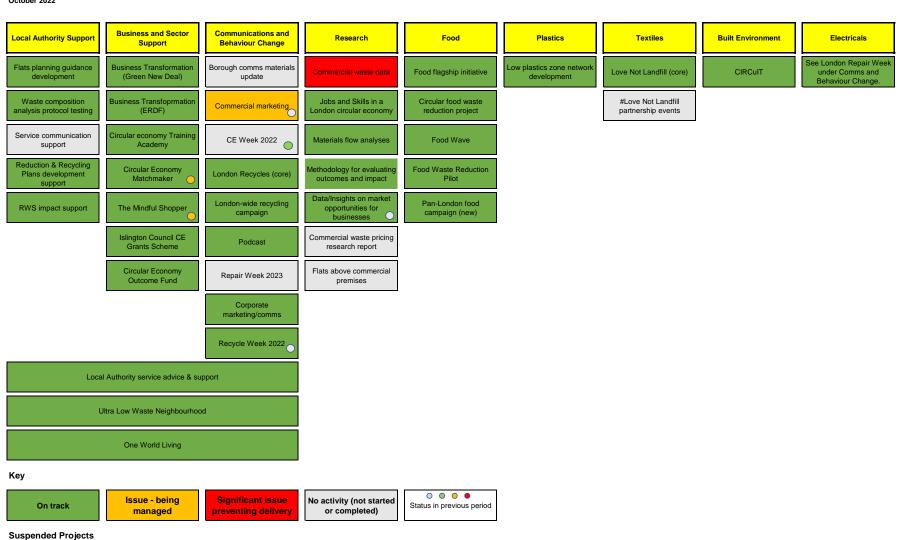

# QI 2022/23 Finance report

(As presented to Audit Committee, 8 September 2022)

#### Introduction

Please note changes to both the format and content of the finance report.

- I. All income is now being presented at the top of the summary accounts to provide a more accurate account of ReLondon's revenue streams.
- 2. Restricted grant income received will be either accrued or deferred to match expenditure.
- 3. Accounts will present invoiced income but will be followed by a section detailing 'secured' or confirmed income and a pipeline of proposals either in submission or in development
- 4. Forecasted changes to full year budget greater than 5% will be explained, (see materiality recommendation).
- 5. Budgets have been phased to reflect expected timing of activity and minimise unnecessary variance reporting.
- 6. The projected year end cash balance (reserves) position will be updated and reported quarterly.

#### Headlines

- Income target has been increased by £553k as a result of greater ambition for fundraising.
- 62% of total income target is secured at end August 2022.
- Total programme expenditure forecast increased by £150k to deliver a new pan London food campaign (new funds have been secured to deliver the work).
- Total net programme expenditure reduced by c£400k due to increased income targets.
- Investments commitments for the year reduced to £2m.
- Total draw on ReLondon reserves reduced by £617k to £4.3m

#### Materiality

At the June Audit Committee meeting it was agreed that levels of materiality and approvals would be agreed. From the SODA:

- Any virements between approved Business Plan budget lines below £50,000 shall require the approval of the Chief Executive Officer and will be reported to the next meeting of the Audit Committee.
- Any virements between approved Business Plan budget lines of between £50,000 and £100,000 shall require the approval of the Audit Committee at the next Audit Committee meeting.
- Any virements between approved Business Plan budget lines over £100,000 shall require the approval of the Board.

The executive recommend that in addition to these approval requirements any change to the full year forecast of a budget line of 5% or more will be explained without exception.

Proposed budget revision for 2022/23: For approval

As requested at the last Audit Committee meeting we propose some adjustments to the budget to recognise increased focus and ambition in relation to fundraising.

We present an income target increased by £553k, which includes the £150k secured for the London Food Campaign for this financial year and a further £402k in new grants.

The board are asked to approve this budget which will then become the baseline that we report against quarterly.

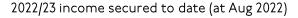

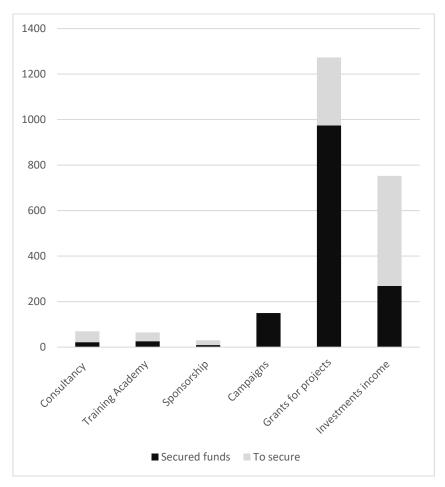

Most income lines are behind budget at end QI however the table and graph below show income at end Aug which has been secured but is either not received or not invoiced for yet.

## Programme Expenditure

Expenditure budgets have been profiled based on expected timing of activity rather than spread equally over the year. As such the costs for quarter one are broadly in line with expectation, with a few points of note:

Business sector restricted grant projects: expenditure here is 27% behind budget, however a significant proportion of this are 'through costs' which will have no significant bearing on ReLondon's year end financial position. Staffing costs, which do have bearing, are mostly on track. The Advance London / ERDF programme has had reduced capacity in the team but a new senior business advisor starts in September and will increase activity and therefore capacity to draw down more funding against salary costs.

Central costs: Most areas of expenditure are in line with expectation, salary costs and professional fees are ahead of budget for QI but expected to balance out in Q2. Verbal update in confidential section.
