



## **London household waste model development**

**Reference: 2024/25 – 07**

### **Questions & Answers**

**1. What is the format of existing data sources (i.e. SQL server, CSV files, or any other format)?**

Excel / CSV files.

**2. Is there a rough estimate of data completeness such as waste data per address or Borough? We would like to get a better understanding of the level of gap fill that will be required.**

The waste composition data we hold is amalgamated data from a number of London boroughs – reportable at subregional (inner/outer) or London level. It does not have any address data within it. The dataset includes total waste arisings per household (hh), material diversion and capture, and residual, DMR and food waste composition (% and kg/hh) for kerbside and communal properties.

**3. The document mentions in section 6 that an Excel model of household waste for London and its subregions (other formats acceptable if Excel not thought to be optimal) is required. Does ReLondon have access to the entire MS suite including Power BI, and is Power BI a tool that ReLondon will consider if deemed more optimal than Excel?**

We are willing to consider other formats than Excel, if these are deemed more optimal

**4. Is there any existing data available for the input of the Waste Model and, if so, what data is this?**

There are data available as follows:

- WasteDataFlow information on waste arisings and diversion, by London borough
- GLA housing projections and population projections for London
- Waste composition data estimates (for London, inner and outer London, subregional level only not borough level) for kerbside properties and flats (total waste composition, residual/recycling composition, material capture rates)
- Data from ReLondon research projects on improving recycling from flats, HMOs and flats above shops (including waste composition analysis data on arisings, diversion and contamination)



**5. Will engagement with the London boroughs be required for data gathering? If so, will any delays in data being made available mean the current project closing date (February 2025) will be adjusted?**

We do not expect any significant additional data gathering direct from boroughs to impact on timescales. If there are significant delays in gathering data, the impact on timescales would be discussed as part of regular project meetings.

**6. Do the up to 4 core scenarios include the baseline BAU scenario, or are they in addition to it?**

The four scenarios include the BAU scenario.

**7. There doesn't seem to be any information on the ITT about how to register as a supplier with ReLondon. Please indicate if there is a portal or supplier registration form that needs to be completed prior to submitting the final tender on 18 September 2024**

ReLondon does not require a supplier registration form to be completed prior to submitting tender proposals.

Supplier registration is only required once the tender is awarded to the successful bidder.
